At Merryhills, we are very proud to publish our 2018 results for the Phonics Screening Check in Year 1; the End of Key Stage 1 and the End of Key Stage 2 SATs. These results are validated in September 2018, including National figures.

Standards in Phonics continue to be exemplary due to excellent classroom practice and highly effective intervention programmes; a consistent approach to the teaching of Letters and Sounds, from the beginning of the children's journey at Merryhills. National phonics results have not yet been published for 2018 but comparison to 2017 is significantly positive!

End of Key Stage 2 SATs: Attainment

The National expectation for children at the end of Year 6 is to achieve a scaled score of 100 or more. Currently, there is no National measure for pupils working at greater depth in Reading, Mathematics and SPAG; in the table below, pupils achieving a scaled score of over 110 have been considered to be working 'at greater depth'.
