

**Responsible to the Headteacher**

- This appointment is subject to the current conditions of employment for teachers contained in the School Teachers Teacher's Pay and Conditions Document.
- Have high expectations for all pupils and oneself to help raise standards
- Plan stimulating work that engages all pupils in their class in accordance with national, LEA and school curriculum policies and in cooperation with senior leaders and colleagues to ensure that the children experience a broad, balanced, relevant and creative curriculum.
- Ensure a close match between the learning experience offered and the individual needs of the children in their class, so as to give each child an opportunity to experience success.
- Plan effectively for all adults within the classroom to enhance progress and learning.
- Where possible ensure that a majority of the children's learning is closely linked to first hand, practical experience.
- Provide children with appropriate opportunities to manage their own learning and become independent learners.
- Provide a secure, happy, safe and stimulating inside and outside environment in which learning can take place.
- Provide indoor and outdoor experiences that challenge and extend learning.
- Nurture each child's self-image and esteem and establish relationships which are based on mutual respect.
- Maintain a high standard of display both in the classroom and in other areas of the school that demonstrate process as well as product.
- Arrange for resources, equipment and materials to be available in such a way that they are properly cared for, easily accessible and will encourage the children to become more responsible for their learning.
- Ensure that the schools agreed curriculum planning takes place and attend any meetings necessary with year group colleagues or other senior staff.

- Assess children's progress, maintain records and provide written reports to parents/guardians in accordance with school policies and to be accountable to pupil progress.
- Observe, record and assess in line with the schools teaching and learning policy. To ensure teacher assessment is used to inform planning and pupil's next steps.
- Have a sound knowledge and understanding of the National Curriculum.
- Ensure that the school's aims and objectives in relation to the curriculum, equal opportunities, discipline etc. are promoted in the everyday classroom organisation.
- Liaise and work with support staff both school based and from the LEA.
- Take responsibility for the management of other adults working in the classroom.
- Be an inspiring, highly motivated and hardworking team member, liaising with other teachers and teaching assistants.
- Undertake any other reasonable and relevant duties deemed necessary to changing needs of the school.
- There will be an expectation to attend activities and functions which are organised outside of the school day.
